Note From The Director

Severson Dells has enjoyed a busy spring full of school programs and the beginning of camp. Children's voices ringing through the woods remind us of the pure joy that nature can bring. We adults are also reminded to get outside and connect with that joy, for it brings rejuvenation like few other things can. I am continually amazed at how much more relaxed I feel even after a 10-minute jaunt in the woods.

This summer and early fall we have a wide range of activities for visitors of all ages. Summer camp continues through the first week in August and many of our camps still have openings. Canoe Convoys launch every Monday evening through the end of July, and we have some amazing adventures coming up this fall with the Forest Quest Scavenger Hunt and a day trip to the Upper Mississippi National Wildlife Refuge.

We are excited to announce an amazing opportunity from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation. They have awarded us a matching grant to support restoration and citizen science at Severson Dells. For every \$1 Severson Dells raises, Illinois Clean Energy will match it with \$3, up to \$21,000. This money supports a few areas of our restoration program: 1) the purchase of tools and safety equipment for our restoration volunteers, 2) the purchase of trees for planting this fall in the oak savanna restoration area, and 3) the purchase of monitoring equipment for our citizen science volunteers to monitor plants and animals before, during and after the restoration. There are two ways you can help. First, consider donating to Severson Dells in support of restoration to help us meet the match. Second, volunteer at one of our Conservation Crew workdays; once we reach 400 hours of restoration volunteer hours, Illinois Clean Energy will give us an additional \$4,000 towards restoration and citizen science efforts. This is a great opportunity to significantly improve the habitat at Severson Dells and we look forward to getting everyone involved.

Have a wonderful rest of the summer--we hope to see you out at Severson Dells soon!

Paddling locations vary each week, but we will be off of the river by 9:00 pm at the latest.

Join Severson Dells staff and volunteers as we explore miles upon miles of fabulous paddling opportunities on the Kishwaukee River! Our instructors help you learn to be a more skillful and confident paddler, and answer questions about river ecology. Equipment, guides and a shuttle are provided. Locations are determined the week before based on weather and river conditions.

If you are interested in participating in additional paddles, you will be placed on a wait list and contacted in the event that we have openings. All participants are required to attend our Quick Start paddle instruction before paddling with us. Quick Starts are offered at 5:30 pm before each trip. Please arrive early to check in before the Quick Start. If you have already participated in a Quick Start with us, please arrive by 5:40 pm to get checked in and geared up .

PARTICIPANTS MUST BE 10 YEARS OR OLDER; those under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. We reserve the right to cancel evening paddles if conditions are unsafe (weather, water level, etc.).

Because invasive species pose one of the most significant threats to nature in our time, vegetation management is a crucial step in the conservation of our natural areas. And you can help! Spend an invigorating morning (or several) as a member of the Severson Dells Conservation Crew, working alongside fellow volunteers to remove invasive species from the woods. Weather permitting, we may make a cheerful fire from the brush we cut. Dress in layers as appropriate for the weather and/or insects.

These restoration days are doubly important because Severson Dells just received a matching grant from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation (see note from the Director on previous page). As a part of this grant, once we log 400 volunteer hours for restoration they will award us an additional \$4,000 to put toward additional restoration projects at Severson Dells. Boundary Waters Winter Adventure

Enjoy the splendor of winter in the North Woods while sampling some of the many activities it has to offer. Dogsled across frozen lakes. Cross-country ski through snow-covered pine forests. Snowshoe under the stars. Enjoy the benefits of a wood-fired Finnish sauna, followed by a refreshing dip in the lake. Relax at night by a cozy fire in the lodge, recounting the day's adventures.

DAY 1: Depart Severson Dells by 9am and head to Duluth, Minnesota. We will spend the afternoon/early evening with The Duluth Experience, enjoying a behind-the-scenes look at the Arts Community, Restaurants and Breweries of Duluth and getting to know each other before heading up to the Boundary Waters the next morning.



DAY 2: We will depart Duluth mid-morning to arrive at Camp Menogyn near Bearskin Lake in the Boundary Waters Conservation Area by late afternoon. To reach the lodge we hike about a mile across the frozen lake. Upon arrival, we'll have time to settle into our accommodations before enjoying dinner. Afterwards, gather around the wood burning stove for an introduction to dogsledding and learning how to dress for the weather.

DAY 3: After breakfast, everyone breaks into groups for half- or full-day activities. Options include dogsledding, hiking to Caribou Rock, snowshoeing down the Back Trail, cross-country skiing to Rose Falls, or trying your luck ice fishing (don't forget your license). Enjoy dinner with the group before experiencing the stillness of a North Woods winter evening. Sleep under the stars in a quinzee (snow shelter) tonight, if you'd like!

DAY 4: If interested, rise early to assist the mushers with feeding and caring for the dogs before enjoying a warm breakfast. Try a new adventure or develop a recently learned skill as you decide between half- or full-day activities. A relaxing afternoon by the lodge's wood-burning stove is always an option, too! Enjoy one last dinner and then brave the sauna and a polar plunge in the lake, if you dare.



DAY 5: Early risers can enjoy one last ski or snowshoe outing before breakfast. Afterwards, pack and transfer personal gear back across the lake for the trip home. We will then hop in the vans and head back to Rockford.

Travel, Terrain, Etc...

TERRAIN/ROUTE: Participants ski, snowshoe, and sled over lakes and through the woods. The frozen lakes provide level and open terrain. Portage trails through the woods can be hilly. The Boundary Waters offers a wide range of route options from easy to very difficult, perfect for a beginner or expert.

TYPE OF TRAVEL/DISTANCE: Participants use cross-country skis, snowshoes, dogsleds, and pulk sleds. Pulks are one-person sleds, powered by another individual, used for transportation. An average day consists of 2-6 hours of activity, depending on weather conditions. Dogsledding is extremely dependent on weather, snow conditions, and the dogs. You can expect at least a 15-minute ride, but if conditions are right, plan on a much longer experience. Travel distances vary from 3-8 miles per day. No previous experience is needed to participate in this trip.

WEATHER: Temperatures in the winter months range from -40 F to +40 F. With proper gear and clothing you can stay very comfortable.

Girl Scouts & Scouts BSA Programs

Severson Dells is excited to offer scouting programs for the 2018-2019 school year. You do not have to be a scout to participate, but the programs are geared to fulfill badge requirements.

Programs meet at Severson Dells Nature Center, 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Dress for the weather: we go out rain or shine. Each lesson meets partial requirements for earning the badge of the same title. We can take up to 15 scouts per lesson: they do not all have to be from the same troop. Fee is \$8 per scout with exception of the Cadette Primitive Camper and the Scouts BSA Field Botany that are \$15/scout and Basketry is \$20/scout because of the additional time and materials required. Dec. 1: Cadette - Primitive Camper*

Every girl scout should know how to "survive" in the woods if necessary. Join us to learn how to build a waterproof shelter, how to make cordage and tie knots, and how to get fire by 'rubbing two sticks together'. *This session runs longer than the usual two hours: 10:00 am – 2:00 am) – bring lunch. Jan. 5: Scouts BSA- Bird Study

Birds are everywhere, and bird-watching is one of the most popular activities in America! We help scouts learn the basics of bird identification: how to use binoculars, what traits to look for when starting bird ID, and how to attract birds to your feeders so you can bird-watch at your leisure. Register by 1/2.

Feb. 2: Senior Girl Scouts - Sky

Sky-watching can be a lot more exciting than you might think. First, there are the clouds: you can tell a lot about the coming weather based on the kinds of clouds you see. Then there are the stars: even in a city, you can still make out some of our most basic constellations, like the Big Dipper and Orion. And although the sky may seem like a whole lot of empty space, it is really quite full of activity: from migrating birds, insects and spiders, to traveling chemicals and pollutants. We can help reveal some of the amazing things that are happening in the sky above. Register by 1/28.

Mar. 2: Scouts BSA - Forestry

Need to learn some tree identification? How about examples of insect damage to native trees? Want to learn more about the role of fire in forest ecosystems? Let us help you on your way to earning your forestry badge by answering these questions and more! Register by 2/27.

Apr. 6: Jr. Girl Scouts - Animal Habitats

Forget the monkeys and kangaroos – we want to teach you about the exciting animals that call Northern Illinois home! Our woods, grasslands and waterways are full of some truly amazing wildlife, and every scout who lives here should get to know it. Come explore our trails with us as we search for clues that will tell us which animals are living where at Severson Dells. Register by 4/2.

May 4: Scouts BSA - Field Botany (Plant Science)*

Are you working on your Plant Science badge? Let us help you earn it by teaching you about some of the amazing native plants that grow in Northern Illinois. Spring is a great time to be introduced to field botany, for the woodland flowers will be in full swing, while the grassland plants are just getting started. We will help you learn to identify some of our native trees, shrubs, woody plants and flowers, as well as the most common invasive species. We will also help you learn how environmental factors affect what grows where. Participants will learn how we control invasives and encourage native species. *This program is longer than the usual two hours: 10:00 am – 2:00 pm. Please bring your lunch and dress to be outside. Register by 4/30.

June 1: Daisies - Outdoor Art

You may not have heard of Andy Goldsworthy, but he is the inspiration for this hands-on outdoor art program. Using sticks, leaves and whatever else we find, we will create Outdoor Art. Some pieces may last only a few hours, while others may last a week or more. The only limit to our creations will be our imaginations. Dress to be outside and get dirty. Register by 5/29.

Refunds will be given to those who cancel five or more days before the class. We need a minimum of five scouts to register in order for the program to go.



Homeschool Programs

Homeschool students/families are invited to join us for a variety of field trips throughout the year to build on your science lessons. Students ages 8 years and up are invited to come out and enjoy an educational morning in nature with our naturalists. All our lessons are at least partly outdoors, and most are entirely outside, so be sure everyone is dressed for the weather. All programs will meet from 9:30 am-11:30am.

Oct. 18: Outdoor Skills

Spending time outdoors can be a lot of fun, especially if you know how to take care of yourself while you are out there! We help build your confidence by teaching some basic outdoor skills, like knot-tying, shelter-building, camouflage and sneaking. Actual lessons taught depend on the age of the students who sign up, but all of these are possible. Register by 10/11.

Nov. 15: Animals Prepare for Winter

Migration, hibernation, or staying put – these are the choices animals face when winter is on its way. How do they choose? Students learn about animals' various survival strategies indoors, and then we go for a hike to search for signs of what our local wildlife are doing. Register by 11/8.

Dec. 20: Predator Prey Palooza

What is a predator? What is prey? Can you tell just by looking at a skull? Do you think you could survive as a predator or a prey animal? We use lots of hands-on fun and games in this up-close look at one of the basic lessons of life: who eats whom! Register by 12/13

Jan. 17: Snow Patrol - Animal Tracking

Join us as we learn how animals move! Indoors we'll learn basic gaits, a few footprints, and play Animal Track Twister. Then we'll head outside to see what tracks we can find and see if we can read the stories they tell. Register by 1/10.

Feb. 21: Birds of a Feather

Birds are the highly specialized descendants of dinosaurs! We'll look at beaks, feet and feathers, learn how to use binoculars as we watch the birds at our feeders, and make a bird feeder to take home. This lesson is mostly indoors. Register by 2/14.

Mar. 21: Journaling and Nature Observation

Learning to be still and observe is an important skill for everyone, especially those who enjoy being outside and watching nature. Participants learn some basic observation techniques and how to record what they observe. Please come with your own journal and writing/drawing supplies. Register by 3/14.

Apr. 18: Biodiversity Investigation

Exploration – that is the name of the game today! Armed with hand lenses and curiosity, we head off trail into the woods and grasslands looking for any and all signs of the critters that call these habitats home. Our goal is to discover which habitat has the greater number of critters (abundance), and which has more types of critters (diversity)...and figure out why. Register by 4/11.

May 16: Aquatic Studies

Learning what lives in the water can be a real eyeopening experience! We spend this morning looking for who lives in the pond and the stream. Participants should expect to get wet – we will be wading in Hall Creek. Required: water shoes (old sneakers or boating shoes) – must completely and securely attach to the foot; no crocs or flip flops – Wellies are also not recommended. We also suggest bringing a change of clothes and a towel…just in case. Register by 5/9.



Book Nook: Natural History Books Worth a Read

Plant Families A Guide for Gardners and Botanists ROSS BAYTON AND SIMON MAUGHAN

Most of us lump plants together in one big family, and when pressed can only explain their grouping by what they're not—not an animal, not a mineral, and so just a plant. In reality, there are hundreds of different plant families, each grouped logically by a unique family history and genealogy. This system brings sense and order to the more than a quarter of a million different plant species covering a diverse spectrum that includes soaring sequoias (*Cupressaceae*), squat prickly pear (*Cactaceae*), and luxuriant roses (*Rosaceae*).

Plant Families is an easy-to-use, beautifully illustrated guide to the more than one hundred core plant families every horticulturist, gardener, or budding botanist needs to know. It introduces the basics of plant genealogy and teaches readers how to identify and understand the different structures of flowers, trees, herbs, shrubs, and bulbs. It then walks through each family, explaining its origin and range, and describing characteristics such as size, flowers, and seeds. Each family is accompanied by full-color botanical illustrations and diagrams. "Uses For" boxes planted throughout the book provide practical gardening tips related to each family.

We have much to gain by learning about the relationships between plant families. By understanding how botanists create these groupings, we can become more adept at spotting the unique characteristics of a plant and identify it faster and more accurately. Understanding plant families also helps us make sense of—and better appreciate—the enormous biological diversity of the plant kingdom.



The Evolution of Imagination STEPHEN T. ASMA

Consider Miles Davis, horn held high, sculpting a powerful musical statement full of tonal patterns, inside jokes, and thrilling climactic phrases—all on the fly. Or think of a comedy troupe riffing on a couple of cues from the audience until the whole room is erupting with laughter. Or maybe it's a team of software engineers brainstorming their way to the next Google, or the Einsteins of the world code-cracking the mysteries of nature. Maybe it's simply a child playing with her toys. What do all of these activities share? With wisdom, humor, and joy, philosopher Stephen T. Asma answers that question in this book: imagination. And from there he takes us on an extraordinary tour of the human creative spirit.

Guided by neuroscience, animal behavior, evolution, philosophy, and psychology, Asma burrows deep into the human psyche to look right at the enigmatic and powerful engine that is our improvisational creativity the source, he argues, of our remarkable imaginational capacity. How is it, he asks, that a story can evoke a whole world inside of us? How are we able to rehearse a skill, a speech, or even an entire scenario simply by thinking about it? How does creativity go beyond experience and help us make something completely new? And how does our moral imagination help us sculpt a better society? As he shows, we live in a world that is only partly happening in reality. Huge swaths of our cognitive experiences are made up of "what-ifs," "almosts," and "maybes," an imagined terrain that churns out one of the most overlooked but necessary resources for our flourishing: possibilities. Considering everything from how imagination works in our physical bodies to the ways we make images, from the mechanics of language and our ability to tell stories to the creative composition of self-consciousness, Asma expands our personal and day-to-day forms of imagination into a grand scale: as one of the decisive evolutionary forces that has guided human development from the Paleolithic era to today. The result is an inspiring look at the rich relationships between improvisation, imagination, and culture, and a privileged glimpse into the unique nature of our evolved minds.




